In response to COVID related concerns, there will be no shared classroom supplies this year. So, students in grades K-5 should plan on purchasing a pencil box type holder to contain writing and craft materials. Here is the recommended size. 21.3 x $14.3 \times 5.1 \mathrm{~cm}$. We ask that families label all supplies very clearly with students' names.

The TI-84 Plus Silver Edition CE and the TI-89 Titanium Edition are preferred, but there are cheaper options that also work.
